




Doug Kelsey, Asst. Treasurer AOSHS Yearbook Initiative

- 1) Goals: Obtain access to yearbooks from all schools and to provide access to all
- 2) Digitization: Provide opportunity to access archives to a very broad audience
- 3) Needs: Donated or loaned yearbooks
- 4) Timeliness: Rapidly approaching the end of the window of opportunity for yearbooks from the 40's and 50's
- 5) Results: Secured twenty-five yearbooks through initiative in last twelve months

OUR SCHOOL

The Frankfurt Community High School building was constructed in the years 1929—1930. Herr Karl May was the architect. The building was the first of its kind in Europe and drew visitors from all parts of Europe and America. The school opened 22. September 1930, as the FRIEDRICH EBERT REFORM SCHOOL. The word "REFORM" in the German Language means "talented". Children from 6 to 14 years of age were enrolled.

In 1933 the Hitler regime re-named the school the DIETRICH ECKART SCHULE. It was then used until 1939 as a German Youth School.

In 1939 the entire building was remodeled. The main portion was used as a German Military Hospital called "LAZARETT ZUM HEILIGEN GEIST". The three wings were used as an Officer's School by the German Army.

In 1944 the building was used for storing furniture of residents in and about Frankfurt who had been "bombed out" by the Allied Armies. It was also used to house many homeless people.

From May 1945 to September 1946 the building was used as billets for American troops, mainly Engineers and Signal Battalions.

On September 2, 1946, the building was vacated in order to be used as the Community High School.

From here, you will be able to zoom in or zoom out for your reading ease.



Website Updates



For more than four million Americans who were educated overseas since 1946, pieces of history could be gone forever – yearbooks, trophies, letter jackets, class pictures, time capsules, school flags and mascots. As schools overseas close down, those artifacts and memorabilia go away, too.

AOSHS needs help to keep the memories alive. Before 9/11, the U. S. Government was providing funding to create an AOSHS museum that would give BRATS and teachers of BRATS a destination to go to and visit their past. Then 9/11 happened, and like many other organizations, AOSHS saw it's funding go away.

AOSHS is still dedicated in pursuing a proper location for all of the artifacts. Soon we will utilize the adjacent space to add to our storage area while displaying some artifacts. Ultimately AOSHS needs to increase the overall size of the current location with the ever-increasing school donations.



Importantly, we need to hire an archivist to preserve this unique collection while making it available to everyone by digitizing the artifacts and create an online museum.

This all takes money that AOSHS does not have. AOSHS operates on a shoestring budget with limited memberships and donations. We need help to fund present and future museum endeavors and hiring the archivist to digitize the collection.




