AOSHS AND DODEA COLLABORATE TO PRESERVE THE PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE HISTORY OF DODEA

The Department of Defense Education Activity (DODEA) and the American Overseas Schools Historical Society (AOSHS) are collaborating to pursue their common goal of preserving the history of the school systems that have educated the children of American military servicemembers for more than seventy years.

As AOSHS continues to develop and organize their archives and as DODEA, under Director **Tom Brady**'s leadership, appropriately utilizes their resources to assist in this effort and to reach out to their current DODEA staff worldwide, this synergy will strengthen efforts to capture history that soon may be

unreachable. This initiative will also provide an opportunity to begin the digitization of all print materials currently in the AOSHS archives. The establishment of a museum in AOSHS's Wichita location will now become a reality. It is anticipated permanent and/or traveling exhibits may be established at DoDEA HQ, at the Pentagon and at other strategic locations. These efforts will enhance public's knowledge, the understanding and appreciation of the contributions made by DoDEA employees to American military and military-connected families for more than seven decades.

As the window of opportunity to reach teachers from the late 40s is

rapidly closing, this renewed partnership is very timely. The graduates of high schools in the late 40s are now in their late eighties. Efforts can be focused on capturing information to fill the gaps in AOSHS's archives. The digitization efforts will enable the vast DODEA community to have access to materials in the archives.

This cooperative effort between DODEA and AOSHS will enable AOSHS to pursue and to reach their ambitious, but realistic goals. Through these combined efforts, the primary goal of collecting, recording and preserving the unique history of educating American military and military-connected children will be achieved

AOSHS is very happy to receive donated copies of yearbooks missing from our archives or we would also be grateful for you to loan us your yearbooks for 30 days while we make copies of them. We now have the capability to digitize print materials. If you are willing to loan us your yearbooks, we will make a digital copy and return the books to you. The only cost to you would be the postage to send the book(s) to Wichita. AOSHS will pay for the return postage. If the postage is an overwhelming burden, we have AOSHS donors willing to pay for the mailing of yearbooks from your home to our Wichita office.

AOSHS welcomes your support of this initiative as we strive to complete our archives. It will be a landmark day when we have a copy of all the yearbooks from each former and current high school in our archives or digital copies of these yearbooks.

Miss Justiniano will be attending SUNY-

Maritime (NY) and will major in Marine Environmental Science, and Miss Cardona will attend Carleton College (MN) as a pre-med student. We wish the scholarship winners and other applicants the very best in their academic endeavors.

Funding for this scholarship was initiated by Brats attending the Overseas Brats Gathering in 2013. The fund has since grown and been adopted by donors of the **Karlsruhe Alumni Association**, the **Colorado Brats Club**, and merchandise sales at the **DoDDS World Reunions** and **Overseas Brats Homecoming 2016**. Significant funding this year came from a successful Facebook fundraiser in early 2018 for which over 40 brats & educators made generous contributions.

For the 2018-2019 school year, AOSHS plans to award another \$3,000 in scholarships to Brats at overseas

schools. In recent months the AOSHS Memorial Program has been undergoing some reorganizing as we move forward toward (gasp!) 2020.

One of the key elements in the Memorial Program, Bricks and Pavers, has, after two decades, come to fruition. As many of you who have been with AOSHS since its early days know, the initial plan for the installation of the bricks, ceramic blocks, and pavers offered in 1999 was to be part of the AOSHS Museum and Historical Park as elements in the proposed outdoor courtyard and walkways. When it became evident in the mid-2000s that we would not have the needed funding to make our museum complex and park a reality, board members sought other alternatives where we might have our "memorial park", but to no avail. Each year solutions were discussed and researched, but locations, costs, and other considerations got in the way. When the option of tiles, both quarry and granite, was introduced as a resolution to the issue, and when we were able to have our own Memorial Wall at our archive facility at 704 W. Douglas Avenue in Wichita, the clouds opened, and the golden rays fell upon us! Finally, we could honor all those who had purchased either a memorial or individual brick or paver! With the collected monies through the years in its own fund, we began ordering the engraved tiles in April 2017 and, with only less than a dozen left to order, all have been purchased and delivered to the archive. Once they have all been installed, we will feature photographs of the permanent display in the AOSHS Quarterly. This brings me to our next item

Throughout the years we have continued to refer to this auxiliary program as "Bricks and Pavers", yet what we now have are tiles, so with that being the case we are renaming the program the **Commemorative Tile Program**. We still have 89 tiles available for sale in assorted sizes:

45	4"x8" Red Quarry Tiles	\$100.00
26	8"x8" Beige Quarry Tiles	\$250.00
16	8"x8" Polished Granite Tiles	\$500.00
2	12"x12" Polished Granite Tiles	\$1,000.00

Once these remaining physical tiles have been sold, the Memorials page on our website will then feature digital tiles in the form of a graphic image including an embossed inscription. Side note: The Memorials page is currently down for maintenance while we update its information.

We are still looking for one of our faithful members to take over the chairman position for the Memorial Program. This is a three-year, voluntary board position. Duties include overseeing incoming memorials sent in by Sponsors who wish to begin a Memorial Fund for a deceased friend or family member, providing their articles for the AOSHS Quarterly along with a Second Notice in the following newsletter, maintaining each fund's status as people donate toward the fund, and providing our organization's webmaster with memorial updates on our Memorials website page. As a board member, this position also requires the volunteer to attend the annual DoDDS Reunion in July where our own annual membership meeting is held as well as the annual board meetings in Wichita, KS, following Labor Day, and be available for the board's teleconferences every other month. 


