AOSHS Reports continued Collection Policy

Do send....

- Artwork with location and date on it
- Awards, class rings, diaries of school events, dissertations, school journals (not vacation)
- Letter jackets or other discernible clothing (cheerleaders, mascots, band, etc.)
- Magazines that feature student accomplishments; either military or host nation
 - News clippings with details of publication and date
 - Pennants
 - Photographs with identification of person(s), location and date
 - Presentations to visiting dignitaries
 - School records
 - Documented information about the mission of a School, District or Region
 - Trophies with specific details of school, event, year
 - Yearbooks
 - Videos or like of school functions and/or events

Don't send...

- Items that are readily available elsewhere, such as commercially published magazines or textbooks
- Broken artifacts, unreadable documents and other materials that are too damaged to be of historical value
 - Personal diaries, videos or disks of holiday or summer vacations
 - Personnel documents that are disparaging to an individual(s) or that contain any personally identifiable information
 - Souvenirs from foreign countries unless school or educationally related *Remember to complete and sign the Property Donation Form*




AOSHS Reports continued Museum Updates

 - √ 708 side of our building becomes archives and presently used 704 to become museum




Original Floor Plan 708/704 W. Douglas








During WWII, American soldiers serving their country were deployed overseas with their families. In 1946, 43 American overseas schools were created for the children of these military families. There were nearly 1,300 students and 116 overseas teachers in these original 43 educational institutions that started it all and continues to the present day.

From this point onward, service members moved overseas to numerous locations with their families and each location required the development of schools for these students. Eventually, the Department of Defense Dependent Schools (DoDDS) was a governmental organization established to orchestrate this educational endeavor.



The term "BRAT" is a status standing for British Regiment Attached Traveler, and it was assigned to families who were able to travel abroad with a British soldier. Eventually, it just referred to military children and was adopted by places around the world,





The American Overseas Schools Historical Society is dedicated to preserving history for past, current, and future overseas alumni, BRATs, teachers, staff, and administrators from all Department of Defense Dependent Schools (DoDDS) overseas schools. Through our searchable online yearbooks, educational records, online museum, online kiosk and online memorials, our organization can keep overseas schools' memories alive that would otherwise be forgotten and lost in this ever-growing digital fast-moving world.

Our searchable online archives allow for overseas teachers, overseas students, BRATs, historians, or those interested in the history of overseas schools to find former classmates, teachers, or school memorabilia and relive their overseas school experience. Browse AOSHS's online overseas school collections including our virtual museum that entails school memorabilia, documentaries, oral histories, and travel books. Other AOSHS online collections include overseas school yearbooks, historical books, memories (written stories), and the Berlin Wall archives.

AOSHS's dedication to converting physical school artifacts to online searchable archives allow visitors from all over the world to conveniently visit the past. As boxes from all over the world arrive weekly full of old school photos, school records, trophies, awards, news clippings, yearbooks, pennants, class rings, written and videotaped histories, and school mascots, AOSHS must catalog them all





AOSHS is dedicated to preserving history for American overseas schools and their past inhabitants. Your donation will allow individuals who had an impact on the American overseas school history to continue impacting generations to come.


