In 2022, **AOSHS** is again awarding scholarships to overseas brats. This year, seniors at overseas small schools will be competing for 3–4 \$1,500 awards. AOSHS has granted over \$20,000 to **DoDEA** seniors since the program started.

Funding for the scholarships, named in honor of **Dr. Tom Drysdale**, initial visionary of AOSHS, was started by Brats at an **Overseas Brats Gathering**. The fund has since slowly grown and been supported by former brats and educators. AOSHS, as a non-profit, has managed this scholarship program from the beginning. AOSHS began offering scholarships in 2015 with a focus on small schools with limited community support.

In 2021, AOSHS awarded four \$1,500 scholarships to seniors from Alconbury, Lakenheath, Edgren (Misawa), and E.J. King (Sasebo). Previous winners were from Vicenza, Daegu, Hohenfels, Ramey, Antilles, Guam, and Ansbach.





LAWRENCE PHILPOT

August 29, 1937 – January 13, 2022



Lawrence (Larry) Philpot, age 84, passed away Thursday, January 13, 2022, in Mena, Arkansas. He was born August 29, 1937, in Hawley, Texas to the late Odis and Blake Philpot. Larry was an adventurer, mentor, and leader with a desire to help others achieve, which led him to coaching and education.

He left his beloved Cherry Hill home to attend Fresno State College with a double major in Social Studies and Physical Education. He met his wife, who was also a teacher, at Fresno High School. He and Nancy raised a family while traveling and working across the world.

In California and Arizona, he advanced his career moving from high school to community colleges to Cal Western University. He is now a Hall of Fame inductee at Scottsdale Community College.

Overseas adventure brought him great years well spent in the military communities of Japan, Turkey, and Germany. In those 20 years with the Department of Defense, he rose from teacher/coach to Superintendent of DoDDS Europe and influenced the lives of countless students, teachers, and administrators along the way.

Larry also never failed to engage with people of our host countries, making lifelong friends with Turks, Germans, and Czechs alike. His world was the world.

He retired to Mena where he spent several decades giving back to the people and community that brought him up. Leading and working with others, he devoted his time and talents to the Board of Trustees at RMCC, Cheery Hill Gospel Church, the Gideons, and Cherry Hill Cemetery, all while still traveling the world as a consultant for the education giants AVID and QSI. He worked for them well into his late 70s.

Larry supported his three children with love, pride, and encouragement to achieve their goals in life, and they did just that – mostly by following the examples of their parents.

And, somewhere in there he managed to go fishing, a lot. There were decades of fishing with his Uncle Bob, his children, his grandchildren, and friends. He was a patient and jolly boat pilot while pulling his family on their tubes, skis, and wakeboards. He found true peace and a twinkle in his eye on those Arkansas lakes and rivers, those sunny and rainy days, those cold early mornings and humid evenings, the eagles soaring with deer on the banks, the homemade sandwiches from a cooler.

Larry Philpot was a great man to his family and friends...a man who did and lived so much in his life.

ANSWERS: 1. Ernest Harmon High School, Stephenville, Newfoundland, Canada. 2. Oslo American School took weeklong field trips aboard the "Svanen" to learn about sailing. The trips were originally sponsored by Mr. Larner and then by Mr. Hal Frank. A unique experience for the Oslo students. 3. M&K stands for Morrison & Knutson, a construction company that builds the buildings on Kadena Air Base. It is believed that this company did the original power systems. Their buildings were later converted to the elementary school. 4. Kleine Brogel Elementary School originally shared its building with a local Belgium school. 5. The SHAPE school, now located in Mons, Belgium, was originally located in Paris, France. 6. The DoDDS school located in Antiqua, West Indies, was Chaffee/White/Grissom Memorial School. 7. Delmenhorst American Elementary School was originally built as a British dependents' school. 8. Ittenhausen American Elementary School was located in a converted German Gasthaus. 9. 


