

In 2023, AOSHS is again awarding scholarships to overseas Brats. This year, seniors at Rota, Spain; Sigonella, Italy; Kadena, Okinawa; and Kinnick, Yokosuka, are competing for three or four \$1,500 scholarships.

Funding for the scholarships, named in honor of **Dr. Tom Drysdale**, initial visionary of AOSHS, was started by Brats at an **Overseas Brats Gathering**. The fund has since slowly grown and has been supported by former brats and educators.

AOSHS, as a non-profit, has managed this scholarship program from the beginning.

Since 2015, AOSHS has awarded nearly \$30,000 in scholarships, with a leaning towards small schools with limited local community support.

Previous AOSHS scholarship winners were seniors at Brussels, Osan, W.T. Sampson, Misawa, Sasebo, Alconbury, Lakenheath, Kaiserslautern, Ansbach, Guam, Vicenza, Daegu, Hohenfels, Ramey, and Antilles.

We are striving to continue to award these scholarships annually, so developing ongoing funding is critical. We would love to hear of any fundraising ideas you or your school may have. ROGER YOUNGMAN

November 1, 1941 – August 25, 2022



Roger Elroy Youngman, 80, of Aberdeen, South Dakota, passed away Thursday, August 25, at Prairie Heights Healthcare, Aberdeen, South Dakota. Roger was born November 1, 1941, in Britton, South Dakota, to Elroy and Arlone (Gage) Youngman and grew up on the family farm west of Hecla. He attended country schools through the eighth grade, later graduating from Hecla High School in 1959.

Both his mother, who was his seventh-grade teacher, and his aunt, Hazel Youngman, herself a lifetime educator, encouraged and enabled Roger to pursue a career in teaching. Roger earned Bachelor of Science degrees in Math and Physical Sciences from Northern State Teachers College (later Northern State University) in 1963. While at NSU, he played football all four years. In 1968, Roger earned his Master of Arts degree in Math from Central Michigan University.

Roger was united in marriage to Karen Dinger in Hecla, South Dakota, on August 2, 1963. Shortly thereafter he started his teaching and coaching career in Bowdle, South Dakota. In 1969, he continued his education career with the Department of Defense Dependent Schools (DODDS) which took his family around the world, first for two years in Japan from 1969 to 1971, then four years in the Azores between 1971 and 1975. In 1975, the family moved to Wiesbaden, Germany, later to Nurnberg, back to Wiesbaden, and finally (after his sons graduated from Wiesbaden American High School) to Bad Aibling in southern Germany. While in Germany, Roger enjoyed coaching football, refereeing basketball, golfing, and frequenting local breweries, especially the Maxlrain Brewery in Bad Aibling.

In 2000, Roger retired from DODDS, returning stateside with Karen to Aberdeen, South Dakota. Roger then served as Superintendent of Schools in Hecla from 2000 to 2002 and in Conde from 2002 to 2006. In 2006, Roger retired after 43 years in education, while continuing as a mentor and friend to many, a role in which he excelled.

Roger was a member of the Bethlehem Lutheran Church, where he volunteered as an usher and served on multiple committees. He was also the Chairman for the Call Committee that brought Pastor Jeff Whillock to Bethlehem Lutheran. Roger held various positions, including as an elected

officer, in the state and local chapter of the National Active and Retired Federal Employees. He also served the community by volunteering with Sertoma.

Roger was an avid golfer and a staunch supporter of Northern State University Athletics. Recently, his alma mater chose Roger to be the 2022 NSU Distinguished Alumnus. Roger held a special place in his heart for the Youngman Homestead, which he passionately restored to its natural state.

Grateful for having shared Roger's life are his wife, Karen Youngman; his sons James (Marisa) Youngman, Scott (Myrl) Youngman, and Todd (Lisa) Youngman; his grandchildren Riley and Jackson Youngman; Tyler (Audrey) Youngman, Mackenzie (Thomas) Roblee, and Trace Youngman; and Elizabeth Youngman; his sister Mary Lee Youngman; and sister-in-law Maureen Youngman. Preceding Roger in death are his parents Elroy and Arlone and his brother Robert.


