#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Because most of us are "of a certain age"...the term Pentagon Papers may dredge up a variety of memories. For me, personally, I was a college student and was (for the most part) really interested in where all these "papers" were going to lead. Needless to say, the Pentagon Papers were an important aspect of the history of that era.

Fast forward to 2023 and once again, Pentagon Papers...well, Pentagon Pictures...is part of my thought process. A short while ago, AOSHS was contacted by Mr. Frank O'Gara, informing us that the Pentagon is putting together a sizeable display of photos in a mural depicting the family life of our military. While the Pentagon has countless photos they are working with, they called upon AOSHS for specific assistance with school and daily life photos. Our Archivist, Adam Gossman, quickly got to work on this project. Guidance was provided by the Pentagon, and AOSHS submitted photos for their consideration and for inclusion in this project. The exhibit is reportedly set to open in coordination with the upcoming **DoDEA** school year.

We are pleased that we were contacted to assist and are happy to do so! It's good to know that our hard work is noticed and that we were called upon to support this exciting project.

Facts to consider regarding AOSHS collections:

AOSHS currently has approximately 65,000 images in its Digital Collection.

AOSHS currently has approximately 4,829 yearbooks in its collection (not including 218 yearbooks from international schools).

AOSHS currently has approximately 250,000 artifacts in its collection.

Many of these items can be viewed on the AOSHS website. The addition of memorabilia, yearbooks, and photos is on-going, thanks to the hardworking staff at our Wichita

museum and headquarters. If you haven't explored our website to find items of interest, please do so at your convenience:



#### **JOEL HANSEN**

As the American Overseas Schools Historical **Society** continues to broaden its recognition globally, there have been several activities and events recently that support these efforts. First, and perhaps the most interesting, is a **Pentagon** project that allows **DoDEA** to share its rich history and mission in educating military dependent children. A wall mural of photos, maps and digital artifacts will be displayed on over 130 feet of wall space in a highly visible corridor in the Pentagon. Through the efforts and expertise of Adam Gossman, our AOSHS Archivist, AOSHS has been assisting with the project. The display is expected to be completed by the start of this coming school year. Many thanks to Frank O'Gara and Will Griffin, past and present Directors of Communications at DoDEA **HQ** for their work on this project.

Second, a connection has been made with the Chief Curator of the National Museum of the United States Army. The process and procedure required to allow AOSHS to share some artifacts and information about DoDEA schools is lengthy and detailed. It may be some time before a physical display will be added to the existing displays in any Army museum, but this is a great start. BG Phil Mattox, AOSHS Military Liaison, has been the front person on this project and has done a phenomenal job of getting our "foot in the door." Stay tuned for further developments.

Third, an extensive review of our goals and objectives has consolidated eight topics into three. They are as

follows: 1) Place AOSHS exhibits into military-connected museums, 2) Grow membership and revenue from donations and 3) Digitize and catalog artifacts from both past and current DoDEA schools.

Goal One is progressing, and major steps have been initiated to expand AOSHS's exposure. The Pentagon project and communications with the Army museum are notable and exciting endeavors. Goal Three is fully underway. The AOSHS office staff is hard at work in making this goal successful. Currently, over 4,000 yearbooks are accessible, and over 65,000 images are digitized and placed online for the world to see. Kudos to them all! As for Goal Two, it has been recognized that COMMUNICATIONS is our largest and most difficult concern. We need donors, we need to recognize them, and extensive work to get the word out far and wide will be required. The efforts of Chris Kyrios, Jamey Hansen, Allen Haymon, Frank Roehl, and Joel Hansen have paved the way to identifying and accomplishing these goals. Chris Kyrios is leading an effort to expand our presence on Facebook which will be a major thrust in communicating better. Rebecca Dunn and Martha **Brown** have reviewed our recognition program and made vast improvements. Thanks to all for the work they do for AOSHS.

Finally, membership continues to grow slowly but steadily. Please pass the word to all who may be interested in reviewing our collections and joining the cause.

#### PLEASE SUPPORT BRAT SCHOLARSHIPS

In 2023, **AOSHS** is again awarding scholarships to overseas brats.

This year, seniors at **Sigonella, Italy; Rota, Spain; Kinnick, Japan;** and **Kadena, Okinawa** are competing for four \$1,500 scholarships. Additionally, alumni from **Kaiserslautern** and **Stuttgart** are funding scholarships specifically for their schools.

The scholarship fund, named in honor of **Dr. Tom Drysdale**, initial visionary of **AOSHS**, was started by Brats at an Overseas Brats Gathering. The fund has since slowly grown and been supported by former brats, educators and the non-profit: **Brats Without Borders**. AOSHS has managed this scholarship program from the beginning in 2015 with a focus on small schools with limited community support and has awarded over \$30,000 since then.

In 2022, AOSHS awarded four \$1,500 scholarships to seniors from: Brussels, Osan, WT Sampson (Gitmo), and Kaiserslautern. Previous winners came from: Misawa, Sasebo, Alconbury, Lakenheath, Ansbach, Guam, Vicenza, Daegu, Hohenfels, Ramey, and Antilles.

We are striving to continue to award these scholarships annually, so developing ongoing funding is critical. 

## IN MEMORIAM

#### **CHRIS LIMES**





Robert Maynard completed his degree at Stetson University around 1960, after which he spent two years teaching at Brentwood Elementary School in Sarasota, FL. Following that, he taught for a year at DODDS in Okinawa and then two years in Bermuda before beginning his career in Frankfurt Germany, where he eventually retired. Despite living abroad, he made sure to return to North Carolina and later Florida every summer, and only missed one Christmas at home. He also pursued a Master's Degree at Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton and successfully graduated.

He grew up in NC near Mars Hill where his sister lives.





Evangelist Shirley Ann Sweetwine was a dedicated educator and religious leader who touched the lives of countless individuals throughout her lifetime. She was born on January 22nd, 1944, in Daytona Beach, Florida, to John and Essie Mae Sweetwine. Shirley was the third of six daughters, and her family moved to Leesburg when she was just seven years old.

Shirley's father was a teacher and coach at Lake County Training School, later renamed Carver Heights High School, where she attended and graduated. During her time in high school, Shirley was a talented musician and played the saxophone in the school band. After graduating from Carver Heights High School in 1961, Shirley became a mother to twins Darryl Levonne and Sherryl Yvonne and

later welcomed another daughter, Roshunya Yvette. Despite the demands of motherhood, Shirley was determined to further her education and went on to earn an Associates of Arts Degree from Johnson Junior College in Leesburg, Florida in 1964, a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology from the City College of New York in 1974, and a Master's of Education from Cambridge College in Cambridge, Massachusetts in 2000.

Shirley started her professional career with the Postal Service in New York City before returning to Florida and following in her father's footsteps to become a teacher. She spent eight years teaching emotionally handicapped and educable mentally disabled students in Lake County Schools. During that time, she also offered tutoring and taught hospitalized and homebound students. Shirley even coached her Elementary and Middle School students in Special Olympics competitions, where her students won gold and silver medals in local, county, and state competitions.

After teaching in Lake County Schools, Shirley moved overseas to Japan with the Department of Defense Dependents Schools (DoDDS), where she taught the children of military members for 11 years. Upon returning to Florida, she continued teaching for several more years before retiring from the state of Florida. Her lifelong passion for teaching was evident through her impact on her students, who continued to reach out to her as adults and thank her for their success.

Shirley also had a strong passion for ministry and evangelism, leading the Women's Ministry, Children's Ministry, and Special Events Ministry at Land O' Lakes Church of God. She continued to serve numerous churches and led the Women's and Special Events ministries throughout her life. Most recently, she was a member of Citadel of Hope Ministries in Leesburg, Florida. As a prayer warrior, Shirley initiated a prayer group that spread across Lake, Pasco, Sumter, and Hillsborough counties. She invited guest ministers who enhanced the prayer group with God-inspired teachings and prayers.

Shirley was a proud grandmother to five grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, and one great-granddaughter. She was a beautiful spirit, a people person, and shared Christ with anyone who would listen.

Additionally, Shirley loved to travel and visited over 20+ countries, experiencing various cultures and sharing her faith with people from all walks of life. Her adventurous spirit and dedication to spreading God's love made a significant impact on those she met during her travels. Her life's work was teaching and evangelizing across the country and the world, as evidenced by her trips to Japan as a guest speaker for numerous congregations.

Shirley was preceded in death by her father, John Wesley Sweetwine, mother, Essie Mae Turner, and sisters: Joan Powers and Carol Monroe.
