AOSHS Expands Presence Beyond Our Walls

In the previous edition of the *AOSHS Quarterly*, we announced several interesting endeavors AOSHS has been pursuing as we follow our quest to expand our presence around the world. The first, the “**Pentagon Mural**,” will be unveiled at the end of **August**. Several Board members, at the **Pentagon’s** invitation, will represent AOSHS at the ceremony. We are eager to be part of the first viewing of this large project. The mural, stretching 132 linear feet down the hall of the second floor of the Pentagon, will display information about our **DoD Schools**, including history, growth, students, teachers, and staff. The current phenomenal academic performance of the students will be highlighted. Included in the mural is a replica of the world map displayed in our museum depicting the names and locations of **over 800 past and present DoD schools** located around the world. AOSHS provided support from the historical perspective in the development of this project. From all preliminary descriptions, the mural will make all of us proud to have been a part of this

fabulous educational organization. We hope to have photos to share in the next *AOSHS Quarterly*.

Additionally, the **National Museum of the United States Army** at **Fort Belvoir** has invited AOSHS to provide stories featuring former students and teachers with military connections either in their roles as students who joined the military or military members who became teachers or administrators in DoD schools. Museum personnel will use the information to create exposés about these individuals highlighting the connections between the **Army** and **DoDEA**. Having a presence in a national museum is a major step for AOSHS. Look for more information on this development in the next edition of the *AOSHS Quarterly*.

At AOSHS, we continue to explore ways to expand our exposure not only to those who have links to DoD schools but also to those who have no knowledge of the schools or the rich history they have providing education to more than **15 million students** since DoD schools began. Your help in spreading the news about our schools, students, and teachers enhances our efforts more than you know. Thank you.

At the recent **DoDDS Reunion**, AOSHS recognized longtime volunteer **Myrna Margraf** as the organization’s **Volunteer Emeritus**. AOSHS Yearbook Initiative for Elementary and Middle Schools

After completing a successful initiative to obtain yearbooks from all **40 existing DoDEA high schools**, AOSHS has now embarked on a similar project for existing elementary and middle schools. There are **140 elementary and middle schools** in DoDEA today. The start of the initiative last spring yielded results from **10%** of these schools. The goal is to have at least **50%** of the schools completed by the end of this school year.

Schools send their yearbooks to AOSHS. AOSHS scans the yearbooks, places them online, and returns the yearbooks to the schools. Ultimately, we expect to have **1,400** elementary and middle school yearbooks online. This project is a joint effort of DoDEA and AOSHS.

WE STILL NEED YOU!! Although these 1,400 yearbooks will be online, hard copies will not be available in the **AOSHS Archives**, since after scanning they will be returned to the schools. If you have yearbooks, photographs, and other memorabilia from any of the 140 existing elementary and middle schools or any of the many elementary and middle schools that closed over the past 75 years,

AOSHS certainly would welcome your contributions to our Archives. Additionally, AOSHS continues to accept high school yearbooks as well.

AOSHS has awarded **\$9,000 in scholarships** to 2023 graduates of the DoDEA education system.

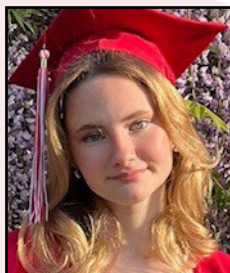
Four \$1,500 Dr. Tom Drysdale Memorial Scholarships went to overseas smaller school seniors **Chloe Bogen** (Kinnick High School, Japan), **Fabiola Mercado-Rodriguez** (Sigonella High School, Italy), **Megan Fife**, and **Cathy Rice** (both of Kadena High School, Japan). Additionally, working with **Kaiserslautern** and **Stuttgart** alumni, **two additional \$1,500 scholarships** were awarded to K-Town senior **Ariana Polk** and Stuttgart senior **Lily Chekouras**.

The winners are excellent students, demonstrated good broad character with volunteer work, and were active in school activities and sports. The awardees' applications were among a record number (22) of highly qualified applicants and were reviewed by a **scholarship committee** from AOSHS, **Overseas Brats**, and for the K-Town/Stuttgart scholarships, their **alums**. This year's winners are the daughters of enlisted military members, DoDEA educators, and a *Stars & Stripes* editor.

We wish the scholarship winners and other applicants the very best in their academic endeavors.

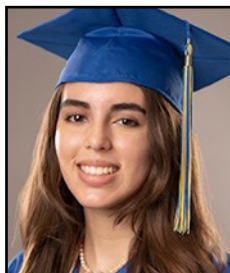

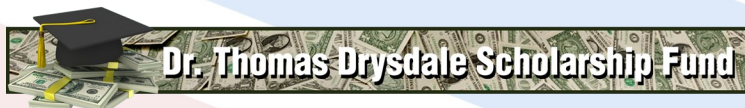

Ellen Goode Minette passed away suddenly, but peacefully, in her sleep due to heart complications. She was preceded in death by her father, mother, and sister, and is survived by her husband, daughter, and son.

Ellen was born in November 1946, the eldest daughter of an Air Force officer, in San Antonio, Texas. During her childhood, Ellen moved around the world with her family, including Japan, Newfoundland, and finally, California. After graduating from college, Ellen left for Europe to work as a school counselor on a military base in The Netherlands.

Over the course of her 30-year career with DoDDS, Ellen served as the Assistant Principal at several Germany-based schools and as the Principal at Heidelberg Middle School and AFNORTH International School. She earned a Doctorate degree in Education from Columbia University Teachers College. In 2007, Ellen was selected

as National Principal of the Year for Middle School.

Ellen met her husband, John, at Stuttgart American High School, where they both coached track and field. They share two children, Kate and Zak, with whom they spent family vacations traveling around Europe, the Middle East, and beyond.

She was an adventurous, quick-witted, kind woman, with an effervescent love for travel, cooking, and family. Ellen, affectionately known as “Rustee” for her auburn hair, will be remembered and missed by her beloved husband, her children, family, and friends across the world.
