Department of Defense Domestic Schools (DDESS Stateside)

Dependent schools on US military installations in the United States and its territories have existed since the early 19^{th} century. West Point Elementary School was established in 1816 as the first one. In most case, the schools were the responsibility of the military posts/bases where they were located.

In 1950, Congress passed legislation that placed the schools under the authority of the U.S. Commissioner of Education, later the Secretary of Education. They became known as Section 6 schools, named for the part of the law that provided justification for them. In 1981, new legislation transferred the responsibility to the Department of Defense. In 1994, another public law replaced the Section 6 school system and renamed it as the Department of Defense Elementary and Secondary Schools or by it better known acronym, DDESS.

The number of Section 6/DDESS schools fluctuated since they were founded, peaking at nearly 100 schools. Presently, there are thirty-eight DDESS schools.

DVS offers a variety of online courses to meet the academic and career-oriented goals of DoDEA eligible students. Course offerings, including Advanced Placement courses, are designed to address all DoDEA graduation requirements.

The online courses offered by DVS have the same level of rigor, adhere to the same standards as the traditional DoDEA curriculum, and align to the same College and Career Readiness Standards (CCRS). The DVS online courses provide the additional benefit of preparing students for success in the 21st century environment through engaging synchronous and asynchronous instruction.

Eligibility to attend the DoDEA Virtual School follows the same eligibility requirements for students attending any DoDEA brick and mortar school. DoDEA Schools include DoDEA Americas, DoDEA Europe, and DoDEA Pacific schools depending on geographical location.

Partnership and Resources Division

As of 29 Sept. 2021

The **Partnership and Resources Division** is committed to support high quality educational opportunities for military connected students. DoDEA mobilizes its experience, access, and technical assistance to expand comprehensive and cohesive educational opportunities for nearly 800,000 children in military families; all of whom are served outside of the DoDEA school system. We capitalize on the relationships that this division cultivates, so to continuously improve support for: academic, artistic, athletic, diversity, inclusion, and social support programs to serve highly mobile military-connected families attending local public schools, or in a duty station not served by a DODEA school OCONUS. Through collaboration and technical assistance, the Partnership and Resources Division team supports local school communities, as well as government and non-government agencies.

- The DoDEA grant program is a powerful tool on behalf of military-connected students, providing resources to over 3,000 schools, educating approximately one million military-connected students across all Services, in 35 states for more than a decade. This investment has resulted in significant gains in student achievement and increased learning opportunities especially in science, technology, engineering arts and mathematics (STEAM), career technology education (CTE), and enhanced transition support programs.
- Since 2008, DoDEA has awarded 559 grants. This is an investment of \$637M impacts approximately 2.3M students including 737K who are military-connected. Grants are DoDEA's opportunity to directly engage and influence the educational opportunities of U.S. public schools, which over 80% military-connected students attend.
 - In FY 21 DoDEA awarded 32 grants totaling approximately \$32M
- DoDEA, in collaboration with the Director of National Intelligence and the Secretary of Education, provided grants to eligible school districts establish, improve, or expand K-12 world language studies. DoDEA awarded 9 grants totaling over \$15M.

DoDEA Partnership and Resources Division administers the DoD Impact Aid Program to eligible public-school districts.

- In FY21, 103 LEAs in 30 states received DoD Impact Aid Supplemental totaling \$50M.
- In FY21, 42 LEAs in 21 states received DoD Impact Aid for Children with Severe Disabilities totaling \$20M.

The **Partnership and Resources Division** has oversight of six **Special Arrangement** contracts in three states and Puerto Rico. These contracts serve 1,485 students for a total of nearly \$33M annually.

The **Partnership and Resources Division** has oversight for policy and management of the **Non-DoD School Program** (**NDSP**) which provides educational support and financial assistance for the education eligible children who are residing in overseas areas where no DoDEA school is available.

- In SY 20-21, NDSP supported just over 4,115 students.
- As of October 1, 2021, the NDSP is supporting students in assigned to 311 duty stations worldwide. Specific NDSP student and duty locations are as follows:
 - o Americas Region 448 Students in 43 duty stations.
 - o Europe Region 2,340 Students in 209 duty stations.
 - Pacific Region 1, 203 Students in 60 duty stations.
- The average annual per pupil cost of a student in NDSP is \$22,904 which includes tuition, transportation, and other academic support expenses (special education, gifted education, etc.)
